# NM REAL ID ( LIST OF ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS

Effective November 14, 2016: Revised rule 18.19.5.12 NMAC provides that the documents listed below are acceptable proof for non-commercial REAL ID driver's licenses and Identification Cards.

Provide certain documents from section A, B and C to get a New Mexico REAL ID. Your documents must be original or certified copies. A certified copy is a copy of a primary document that is endorsed by the entity that issued the original document. Photocopies, notarized photocopies and non-certified copies are **NOT** acceptable. A REAL ID can only be issued **AFTER** MVD has electronically verified the Lawful Status and Identification Number documents.
